Objectives:

- To explore set texts for IGCSE Literature selection 2025/2026 by providing background information on author and context, a general overview of plot and major themes exposed to determine how age appropriate each text may be.
- To comment on the options for poetry: Songs of Ourselves versus single-author selections.
- To look into Drama alternatives by considering author, setting, language, themes and degree of relatability with students of specific age groups.
- To share teaching experiences regarding previous selections, how they worked in class, student response to them and general criteria for text selection.

Contents:

- Presentation of Set Texts for Literature IGCSE 2025/2026 for Poetry, Prose and Drama.
- Introduction to the authors, genre, plot, themes and linguistic complexities of each choice.
- Discussion of the pros and cons of each choice regarding target age, time needed for in-depth analysis and suitability of each text for a passage-based exam.
- Sharing of experiences, advice and personal views.
