Objectives:

3. Create learning experiences that foster curiosity, questioning, reflection, and deep engagement with texts.
4. Empower students to become confident, independent readers who flexibly apply a repertoire of comprehension strategies across contexts and disciplines.

- Understanding reading comprehension and strategic reading.
 - Before-, during-, and after-reading comprehension strategies.
 - Explicit teaching of comprehension through modeling and guided practice.
 - Questioning, inferencing, summarizing, synthesizing, and critical thinking.
 - Assessment and monitoring of comprehension.
 - Building autonomous, reflective, and lifelong readers.
