She has further specialized in Literature at the I.E.S.L.V. "Juan Ramón Fernández" and her main research interests lie in the fields of Postmodern Alter(ed)native Texts, Derridian Deconstruction and the Digital Humanities.

Objectives:

Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) is the process through which children and adults acquire and effectively apply the knowledge, attitudes, and skills necessary to understand and manage emotions, set and achieve positive goals, feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain positive relationships, and make responsible decisions. The purpose of this workshop is to take advantage of the pedagogical potential of short stories to delve into Social and Emotional Learning. We will delve into the intersection of literature and socioemotional learning, and explore methodologies to use literary works as a catalyst for empathy development, enabling students to navigate complex emotions and perspectives through textual exploration. To this end, we will read some stories and carry out some activities in order to encourage discussion among participants.
